Entries will not be accepted after the specified dates except in such special circumstances as may be approved by the RAS.

AWARDS, CERTIFICATES & PRIZES

All participating finalists will receive an RAS Certificate of Participation and other Awards and prizes as may be specified.

ENTRY FEES

FREE (unless otherwise specified)

INCORRECT AND INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS FOR ENTRY

A Correction Fee of up to \$20 may be charged by the RAS, at its discretion, for each Application for Entry which is incorrect or incomplete. If an Application for Entry is not rectified in accordance with the RAS' requirements, the entry may not be accepted by the RAS.

PERPETUAL TROPHIES

Perpetual Trophies remain the property of the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW. Ownership of the Trophy does not pass to the winning Competitor. A medallion will be presented to the annual winner whose name will be engraved on the Trophy.

PRIZES AND GST

The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an Exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise.

The information an Exhibitor provides on the Application for Entry determines whether GST is applicable.

Any prize stated in this Schedule does not include GST.

GST will not apply:

- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as a hobby or private recreational pursuit; or
- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, but the Exhibitor is NOT REGISTERED for GST.
- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor is not entitled to an ABN as the business or enterprise is not operating in Australia.

GST will apply:

- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, and the Exhibitor is REGISTERED for GST.

Where GST applies, the RAS will pay the prize money quoted in this Schedule plus 10% GST. The RAS will issue a recipient created tax invoice.

WARNING: The Exhibitor must complete the **Tax Details** on the Application for Entry. Failure to do so will result in the RAS deducting 47% of the successful Exhibitor's prize money as Pay As You Go Tax (PAYG). The RAS recommends that the Exhibitor seeks professional advice before completing the Tax Details.

PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

Prize money won during the Sydney Royal Easter Show will be paid by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) to the bank account nominated for the Exhibitor in the competition entry system (myRAS) at the time the RAS commences processing a payment. If the bank details are incomplete or incorrect, the RAS will attempt to contact the prize winners to confirm payment details.

The RAS seeks to finalise all prize money payments by the end of June. Queries regarding unpaid prize money can be addressed to the Service Centre by email at competitions@rasnsw.com.au.

Any prize money left unclaimed for a period in excess of six months, is deemed forfeited by the Exhibitor.

SUPPORTER PRIZES

Prizes are provided by third parties and the RAS advises that any such prizes may be subject to change or amendment occurring at any time, thereby making the original information published incorrect.

REPORTING TIME

Competitors in their respective Classes are required to report at the location specified 15 minutes (unless otherwise specified) prior to the times set down in this Schedule for the commencement of the Competition.

TIMETABLE

Please refer to the Competition Timetable on page 6 for specific dates and locations for each Competition.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN

Exhibitors must comply with all applicable Working with Children Legislation.

Exhibitors over the age of 18 years, who are involved in a child-related role or have direct unsupervised contact with children, must produce evidence of Working with Children Checks to the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW, at least one (1) month prior to Competition.

WORKPLACE SURVEILLANCE ACT

The RAS operates surveillance cameras from Sydney Showground Security and these are located in and around facilities requiring security monitoring for the safety or security of individuals or property. The RAS also has access to Sydney Olympic Park security cameras and vice versa. Please note that security camera monitoring is continuous and ongoing and it is deemed that a person, by entering the Showground, consents to this photographing, filming or taping. The RAS strictly complies with the *Workplace Surveillance Act 2005* (NSW).

YOUNG JUDGES COMPETITIONS SPECIAL REGULATIONS

The RAS General Regulations apply to all Sections of the Show. These Young Judges Competitions Special Regulations apply to this Section only. If there is any inconsistency between the General Regulations and the Young Judges Competitions Special Regulations, the Young Judges Competitions Special Regulations prevail. Copies of all Regulations are available from the administration office at the Showground. General Regulations are available at www.rasns.com.au

1. Competitors must be at least 15 years of age and under 25 years of age, as at 1 May 2026, unless otherwise specified.
2. Some Societies when submitting entries may have age and other variations for certain Young Judges Competitions. Such variation must have prior approval from the RAS. A date of birth must be shown on the Application for Entry. The Chief Steward only may request a Statutory Declaration.
3. All entries must be submitted through the myRAS Competition entry system including Competitors that have qualified or been nominated by AgShows NSW or relevant Breed Society.
4. The number of Exhibits to be judged in each Young Judges Competition Class shall be four, labelled 1, 2, 3 and 4 respectively.
5. Unless otherwise specified, there shall be a Competition Judge for a breed or Class, a Judges' Steward, an Announcer Steward and one or more Ring Stewards and Assessor Stewards. In animal Classes where a breed type is specified, such Class may be changed without notice at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
6. Visual Judging, Judging Techniques and Handling (where required) shall be completed prior to the commencement of the Oral Judging.
7. Handling: For all Classes that include points for handling, the Competitor will be scored on their ability to judge each Exhibit with sufficient handling to adequately assess all characteristics, and with sufficient care to avoid causing any deterioration in the appearance of those Exhibits.
8. At the discretion of the RAS of NSW Young Judges Special Committee and subject to the conditions for each Competition, a minimum number of Six (6) top-placed Competitors in the Visual Judging will participate in the Oral Judging. All points awarded including Judging Techniques and Handling shall be included for the selection of the Oral Competitors.
9. In all Competitions an outright winner and outright placegetters must be declared. In the event of a tie where two or more Classes are judged, the winner will be determined from the highest mark from Visual Judging. If the highest mark from Visual Judging is the same, the Competition Judge will decide at their discretion, the winner and/or placegetters by one whole point.
10. Up to five (5) ribbons may be awarded in any one Competition.
11. Oral Section: A maximum of two minutes shall be allowed for Oral comments unless otherwise specified. Points shall be deducted for comment beyond the allowed time. Points shall be awarded in the Oral Section for accuracy of observation - 15 points, ability to compare Exhibits - 15 points; speaking ability - 10 points; presentation and dress - 10 points; Total 50 points.
12. Dress: Competitors must be neatly and suitably attired. Male Competitors shall wear a tie and female Competitors shall be attired to a similar standard. Closed shoes or boots must be worn. Shorts and thongs are not allowed. Points shall be deducted for poor presentation. Some sections specify specific dress requirements.
13. Winners of two State Finals and RAS of NSW Young Judges Finals in any one Class shall not be eligible for future Competition in that Class.
14. National Winners (ASA) shall not be eligible for future Competition in that Class.
15. Once a Competitor has qualified to represent a Group at Sydney Royal Easter Show in any one of the Judging Competition State Finals, they may not enter another Group Final as a potential qualifier in that type of Competition in that Competition year. They can, however, enter any one or more Group Finals anywhere in the state, for practice (and score), in the same type of Competition as one in which they have previously qualified as long as they disclose this to the Group Final organisers at the time of entry and indicate that they are not eligible for a placing in that event.
16. For RAS/AgShows NSW Competitors, a Competitor cannot represent more than one AgShows NSW Group.
17. Maximum number of Competitors in all RAS Competitions shall be sixteen (16) unless otherwise specified.
18. A conversation between a Competitor and Person, other than a Young Judges Competition Steward, is not permitted during judging and may be deemed by the Chief Steward of that Section to be outside assistance. Competitors will be eliminated from the Competition if deemed by the Chief Steward to be receiving outside assistance. The Chief Steward's decision is final.
19. Winners of the RAS/AgShows NSW State Finals held at the Sydney Royal Easter Show are eligible to compete at the Agricultural Shows Australia National Finals.
20. Competitors must reside in either NSW or the ACT; or be in regular paid employment in NSW or the ACT; or be in full-time education in NSW or the ACT at the time of first competing in any Competition year. Competitors from other states may be accepted at the discretion of the Young Judges Special Committee.

Judging Day: Tuesday 7 April 2026

Venue: Flower & Garden (Southee) Pavilion

Prizes: Champion \$500, Reserve Champion \$125, 3rd Place \$75 supported by Royal Agricultural Society of NSW.

The Champion also receives an AgShows NSW Plaque and all participating finalists from AgShows NSW receive a \$50 gift card provided by AgShows NSW.

Nominations are automatically accepted for the 1st and 2nd placegetters from Group Final Competitions held by Show Societies under the auspices of the AgShows NSW.

Conditions applicable to this Competition (Please refer to the above website for a full copy of the Rules, Procedures and Guidelines):

The Competition will be conducted as follows:

1. Three Classes of grains with four Exhibits in each Class will be judged in the Competition.
2. Eight minutes will be allowed for the judging in each Class.
3. Maximum score for the Competition shall be 210 points, 50 for each of the three Classes, 10 for handling and 50 for the Oral Section.
4. Prior to judging each competitor will nominate their choice for oral judging. Each competitor in the Oral Class is allowed 2 minutes to explain the reasons for their placing. Once the two minutes has been reached, 1 mark per 10 seconds or part thereof will be deducted from the total score by the stewards.

Judging Day: Tuesday 7 April 2026

Venue: Flower & Garden (Southee) Pavilion

Prizes: Champion \$100, Reserve Champion \$75, 3rd Place \$50 supported by Royal Agricultural Society of NSW.

The Champion also receives an AgShows NSW Plaque and all participating finalists from AgShows NSW receive a \$50 gift card provided by AgShows NSW.

Conditions applicable to this Competition (Please refer to the above website for a full copy of the Rules, Procedures and Guidelines):

The Competition will be conducted as follows:

1. Three Classes of fruit and/or vegetables with four Exhibits in each Class will be judged in the Competition.
2. Six minutes will be allowed for the judging in each Class.
3. At the discretion of the Competition Judge, a specimen of each Exhibit in a Class may be sliced to allow an internal visual assessment.
4. Maximum score for the Competition shall be 210 points, 50 for each of the three Classes, 10 for handling and 50 for the Oral Section.
5. Prior to judging each competitor will nominate their choice for oral judging. Each competitor in the Oral Class is allowed 2 minutes to explain the reasons for their placing. Once the two minutes has been reached, 1 mark per 10 seconds or part thereof will be deducted from the total score by the stewards.

Conditions:

Dress Code: Competitors must be neatly and suitably attired with either long sleeved shirt and jacket, and male Competitors must wear a tie and long pants. Long hair is to be restrained and only minimal jewellery is acceptable. Closed in shoes are essential. Shorts, chewing gum and poor presentation is unacceptable and will be marked down accordingly.

THE RAS JUNIOR ALPACA HALTER YOUNG JUDGES COMPETITION STATE FINAL

Competitors must be at least 12 years of age and under 15 years of age, as at 1 May 2026.

Judging Day: Monday 13 April 2026

Venue: Alpaca (Munro) Pavilion

Prizes: Champion \$100, Reserve Champion \$75, 3rd Place \$50, supported by Royal Agricultural Society of NSW.

A ribbon will be awarded to each prize-winner.

THE RAS ALPACA HALTER YOUNG JUDGES COMPETITION STATE FINAL

Competitors must be at least 15 years of age and under 25 years of age, as at 1 May 2026.

Judging Day: Monday 13 April 2026

Venue: Alpaca (Munro) Pavilion

Prizes: Champion \$100, Reserve Champion \$75, 3rd Place \$50, supported by Janie Forrest & Ian Davison from the Coolaroo Alpaca Stud.

A ribbon will be awarded to each prize-winner.

Conditions:

1. The RAS Alpaca Halter Young Judges Competition State Final will consist of one Class of animals in halter; of Huacaya or Suri comprising of four Exhibits in the Class. This is to say that if the animal in the Halter Section is Huacaya, the Fleece Section should be Suri.
2. Exhibits at the Show in which the state final is being held may be used only if unplaced.
3. Exhibits must be identified by 'breastplates' or 'armbands' numbered one, two, three, four (1, 2, 3, 4), and not A, B, C, D with relevant measurements recorded on them.
4. Prior to the commencement of judging the Competition Judge is to instruct the Judges Steward on the Class that the oral

judging will occur on. This is to be communicated to the Competitors via the Stewards.

5. Process of visual judging
 - a. Visual judging of the Halter Class will take place first. There should only be four Competitors assessing each Class at a time for animal welfare reasons.
 - b. Competitors will be allowed ten (10) minutes per Class.
 - c. Parading of Animals
 - i. Animals are to be led individually into the ring in a clockwise direction in numerical order, one, two, three, four (1, 2, 3, 4) and lined up as per normal halter Classes in frontal profile. The Competitors will be allowed to observe the animals as they are being paraded to assess gait and conformation. The parade diagram must allow for clear visual of gait and conformation by use of straight lines in their parade.
 - ii. Timing commences at the point all animals are lined up in the ring.
 - iii. Competitors will inspect the animals over a period of ten (10) minutes from rear, frontal and lateral profiles, allowing half a minute for the alpacas to be stood in lateral profile, to be collectively and comparatively assessed.
 - iv. Time will be called two (2) minutes prior to the completion of the allocated time.
 - v. Competitors' Placing Cards to be handed in at the conclusion of ten (10) minutes.
6. Process of Oral Judging for Halter Class:
 - a. At the discretion of the Judge based on points from the visual judging, a minimum of 8 Competitors from the visual judging will participate in the oral judging. Reading from notes is discouraged at state finals.
 - b. Before the commencement of the oral presentation, each Competitor is required either to give instruction to the Ring Steward or, to place the ribbons on the animals in placement order. The ribbon colour order being Blue - First (1st), Red - Second (2nd), White - Third (3rd), Yellow - Fourth (4th).
 - c. Each Competitor in the Oral Judging is allowed two (2) minutes to speak, explaining their placing from their nominated group of animals. Penalty points apply - One (1)

point should be deducted for every ten (10) seconds or part thereof over the allotted two (2) minutes.

- d. Competitors in the Oral Class are scored on their judging craft, accuracy of observation, their comparative statements, speaking ability and general presentation and dress.
7. Awarding of assessor marks will occur as follows: -

1. Two Classes each of four merino fleeces will be judged. Fleeces used may, but not necessarily, have been exhibited at the Show in which the Judging Competition is held. Each fleece will be judged using the 1995 Scale of Points as issued by the National Council of Wool Selling Brokers of Australia, and placed in order of merit by the Competition Judge and the Competitors will use a Non-Oral Classes Card for each of the two Classes. Competitors will be allocated five minutes to judge each fleece.
2. Visual or Non-Oral Judging will take place first with competitors selecting which group of fleece samples they will speak on. As well as the Non-Oral Card, Competitors are provided with the Reason Card, for their use in noting the points of difference. Notes should not be referred to during the oral presentation.
3. The winner of the Competition is arrived at on points scored from a maximum of 200 points: 50 for the correct placement of Exhibits in each of the two Non-Oral Classes, 50 for their handling of fleeces in one Non-Oral Class and 50 for the Oral Class.
